



Loop knit and plain knit selectable just by simple switch! Divers lovely fabrics can now be knitted out!

6 PARTS IDENTIFICATION OF KNITTER

This knit switch for switching between Plain Knit and loop Knit




● Suggestion on the degree of thread's tightness




6 PRACTICE BEFORE STARTING TO KNIT

Put the main body on a stable, flat tabletop and set the knit switch to "Tube Knit" up (⊕) position. Turn the handle clockwise for a while to get familiar with such operation. Then you can start to set thread onto the unit



HOW TO SET THREAD


1. Set the knit switch to "Tube Knit" up (⊕) position.




2. Lower the thread into the cylinder.




3. Turn the handle forward. The central needle right before you will go up. Set the thread to the inner space of the hook of needle 1 to the right of the thread inlet, as the figure shows.




4. Set the thread in a skipping way, that is, set to one needle and then skip the next one. For example, let the thread first pass through the inner space of the hook of needle 2, and when it comes to needle 3, guide the thread through the inner space of the hook of the needle again. Slowly turn the handle clockwise at the same time.



5. In the above-mentioned way, alternately guide the thread pass the hook's inner space and the back of the needles till the thread circles the cylinder once. If the thread has been correctly set, it should finally pass the back of the last needle.




6. As shown in the figure, let the thread pass through the thread inlet then put it on the thread holder.




KNITTING ABC BASIC KNITTING METHODS

TUBE KNIT METHOD


A tube-knitted fabric will look as the right figure shows.



1. After correctly setting the thread onto the unit, you can go on to knit. While turning the handle, remember to loosen the thread in front of the thread inlet. Turn the handle slowly in the first three circles. After four or five circles, remember to pull the thread end in the cylinder tight before going on.



When the thread is running out or when you want to change to another thread of different color.....



Sever the thread and join with the new thread, as the figure shows. Then you can turn the handle to go on knitting.




6 HOW TO SEPARATE FABRIC FROM KNITTER

1. Remove the thread from the thread inlet, and sever at a point about 30cm from the fabric.

2. Hold the thread end vertically and turn the handle clockwise for the cylinder to rotate slowly. The fabric will then be gradually separated from the needles.






6 HOW TO TREAT THREAD ENDS IN LOOP KNITTING

FINAL THREAD END
To make the stitches look neat, please knit a little more than necessary and then undo the surplus part.




STARTING THREAD END



PLAIN KNIT METHOD

1. A Plain-knitted fabric will look as the right figure shows, and set the knit switch to "Plain Knit" down (⊖) position.




2. Turn the handle counterclockwise till the limit



3. According to step one of the loop knitting method to set the thread onto the knitter.




5. When you have finished knitting, set the knit switch to "Tube Knit" up (⊕) position, and separate the fabric from the knitter. (Please refer to relevant instructions in the "How to Separate Fabric from Knitter".)




6 HOW TO TREAT THREAD ENDS IN PLAIN KNITTING

FINAL THREAD END
To make the stitches look neat, please knit a little more than necessary and then undo the surplus part



STARTING THREAD END

1. Guide the starting thread end through the eye of the knitting needle.
2. Form a tube with the thread, guide the knitting needle through the loop and pull tight.
3. Sew some more thread onto the fabric and cut off the surplus end.
